

Good to be Green In Reception



Good to be green is a simple scheme that encourages good behaviour. Each child has their own name pocket and their very own Good to be Green credit card. Children are encouraged to try to follow our classroom rules and stay on green. Some children sometimes find this difficult at times, and when children have had a verbal warning they receive a yellow warning card. This then replaces their green card in their pocket. If unsuitable behaviour continues the children will receive a second yellow card and parents receive a yellow letter home explaining their child's behaviour.

At the end of each half term the children are rewarded for their good behaviour by having a treat in First Steps, such as a party, soft play or music concert. The children also get a badge to celebrate their good behaviour. Children who have had a yellow letter sent home do not receive their badge and should try to stay green next term so that they can get a badge.
