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Impact

- Enrichment activities have enabled more children to access a wider range of sports provision for example gymnastics, football, rugby, basketball, taekwondo and Athletics to County standard.
- Due to a wide range of provision for PE teaching within school with specialist coaches our club attendance is good.
- Children speak with great confidence about the range of PE opportunities within school. They can clearly articulate the reasons for taking part in active sessions and how important it is for their healthy lifestyle now and in the future.
- FISCH project with NHS, Health staff involving both parents/carers and children has supported the school in equipping them for a healthy, active lifestyle.
- In staff observations it is evident that there are improved physical skills, stamina and resilience in PE sessions and other curriculum areas.
- Partnership with School Games there has been an increased participation in competitive sport which has enabled our school to achieve the School Games Bronze Level Award.
- New equipment ensures that health and safety measures are met and there are more opportunities to try out different sports.
- Sports Leaders also organise whole school events such as the Runathon, Sports Days and Sports relief which have shown community participation and an ability to fundraise successfully. This impacts on our children's economic wellbeing through enterprising initiatives.
- Swimming provision has enabled all Key Stage 2 pupils to access tuition and majority of Year 6 pupils reaching ARE at end of Key Stage.

Planning for future/ Sustainability

The PE coordinator and the SLT will continue to monitor our action plan to identify future needs.

- In the coming year, we plan to use the funding to:
- Further develop opportunities for varied sports experiences for our pupils.
- Pursue improvements to the existing play areas, to continue to encourage physical activity at play and lunchtimes.
- Develop Young Sports leaders Programme
