

St Wilfrid's RCVA Primary School – Sports Premium (2018-19)

In the academic year 2018-19 we will receive £18,080 Sport Premium funding. This funding can only be spent on Sport and PE provision in schools. We will spend this funding to ensure that all five grant conditions are fulfilled. The grant conditions are as follows:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles.
2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
5. Increased participation in competitive sport.
